

**Mo-BRUK does not agree with the decision of the Marshall of Lower Silesia Voivodeship and will file an appeal**

**With reference to Current Report No. 12/2021 pertaining to the decision issued by the Marshall of Lower Silesia Voivodeship imposing on Mo-BRUK a fee in the amount of PLN 61,230,674.00 for alleged storing of waste in Wałbrzych without an approved landfill operation instruction, the Company's Management Board hereby declares that it does not agree with the decision issued by the Authority. Mo-BRUK will file an appeal to the Local Government Board of Appeals by the deadline stipulated by the provisions of law.**

After carrying out a legal analysis of the received decision, Mo-BRUK's Management Board deems it groundless and rejects the argumentation of the Marshall of Lower Silesia Voivodeship in its entirety. In the opinion of Mo-BRUK's Management Board, the decision contains a bizarre justification and is unlawful. In addition, Mo-BRUK's Management Board emphasizes that the Authority did not take into account important arguments (which were known to it) indicating that the company acted in the matter at hand in compliance with the law.

At the same time, Mo-BRUK's Management Board emphasizes that earlier appeals to second instance authorities following from the decisions of the Marshall of Lower Silesia Voivodeship in other cases were many times effective.

**On the Company:**

The Mo-BRUK Group is the leader in the processing of industrial and hazardous waste and selected fractions of municipal waste in Poland. The Company uses waste to produce, among others, alternative fuels, which are a precious energy fuels, and produces, using its proprietary, patented technology, artificial aggregate used, among others, in road construction or as a reclamation material. The Mo-BRUK Group has two incineration plants in which it processes, among others, medical and hazardous waste. Since 2012 the Company's shares have been listed on the main floor of the Warsaw Stock Exchange.
